SDC is located in Karenni Refugee Camp 1. On the Thai - Myanmar border. It was founded in 2002 by three alumni of EarthRights School Burma (ERSB).

The ERSB Alumni had learnt about Democracy, Law and the Environment. They wanted young people in their community to be able to study these subjects as well so they founded SDC.

SDC has produced over 200 Human Rights and Environment activists since its formation. Our coordinator and co-founder Aung Sun Myint continues to work with our team to realize the vision he set out with his fellow ERSB alumni in 2002.

According to our schedule for November 2015 we have implemented some activities at our SDC training center in camp and at the SDC, ERI joint program office in Nai Soi.

During November, students on the basic course were provided with lessons on the subjects of Criminal and Civil Law, dam issues, basic economics, ICCPR (International Covenant Civil and Political Rights) and Democracy by SDC staff in camp.

For the practical element, the Basic Course students have

written and produced their Research Reports, which were researched and collected from their fieldwork and internships in October. In the first week of November, students shared their experiences of what they have learned from their fieldwork and internships and had an opportunity to present their research reports to their classmates.

On the Advanced Course, the students implemented their campaigns. The campaigns were on human rights and education related to their research and consultations which they conducted in in karenni refugee camp#1.

Before the start of the campaigns the students wrote Proposals to their teachers, then after they successfully conducted their campaigns they wrote detailed reports on their activities. These subjects and activities were completed with the assistance of our volunteers.

The 6th Advanced Course ended on the 28th November, 2015. The students graduated on 10th December 2015, a Ceremony was held in our campus in Camp, where the students were presented with graduation certificates, and the best students were given awards to recognize their achievements.

On the 28th of November, we had a farewell party for our departing volunteers Nathan and Nastassja, where we had the opportunity to show them our appreciation and thank them for their hard work and great contribution to SDC.

Basic Course students arrived on the 12th of December in the Nai Soi SDC campus, where they will have an opportunity for full immersion as they start learning and improving their English. The students will attend until March.

The whole of the Basic Course student body is split into two groups of about 22 students, and they will rotate every two weeks. They will be learning English, Taught by our foreign volunteers and attend computer classes with teacher Neh Reh. In the evening they will have an opportunity for computer practice and also engage in one to one English conversation with the teachers.
