Where do the Karenni Social Development Center's funds go?

Based out of Karenni Refugee Camp #1, in Mae Hong Son Province, Thailand, the KSDC works to address nearly 70 years of human rights abuses, widespread discrimination of ethnic minorities, and wholesale destruction of environmental systems throughout Karenni State and Myanmar. To accomplish this goal the KSDC empowers new generations of Karenni advocates with the knowledge and skills needed to promote non-violent social movements demanding respect for human and indigenous rights, democratic governance, and the preservation of the Karenni environment.

STUDENT TUITION

A student's annual tuition is \$670. The majority of the SDC's funds go directly towards our students and their education. This includes a stipend, daily meals, classroom supplies, and room & board.



INFRASTRUCTURE

A significant portion of our budget goes to our facility's rent, daily upkeep and repair, and furniture including beds, desks and chairs, kitchen supplies, and support for our farm.



UTILITIES

Utilities include internet, electricity, water, and gas for cooking. Internet is especially vital at the SDC as the refugee camp does not have internet access so the Center allows students to connect with their relatives living in Karenni State.



TEACHER SALARIES

A teacher's monthly salary at the SDC is \$100. The SDC's teachers and trainers are an invaluable asset to the center. Many of the teachers are alumni of the SDC and have rich experiences working for local NGOs supporting human rights and the environment.
